REVIEW AND AMENDMENTS

ANY proposed / desired changes to these Championship Regulations must be submitted to the Controllers for approval. The Controllers reserve the right to introduce new Regulations and / or amend existing Regulations with the approval of Motorsport South Africa (MSA).

Amendments and updates to the rules will be recorded in the Amendment Record, detailing the updated version, date of approval of the amendment and a short summary of the amendment. The new version of the rules will be published by MSA at least seven (7) days prior to the next event being held unless a shorter notice period is approved by MSA.

All race meetings shall be held under the 2023 MSA General Competition Rules (GCR's), Standing Supplementary Regulations (SSR's) of Motorsport South Africa (MSA), these Club Regulations, the event Supplementary Regulations (SR's) and any applicable Circulars of MSA for Enduro. In the event that the Club Rules are silent, the National Rules shall, at all times prevail.

1. CONTROLLERS

CSMX club Committee.

2. ELIGIBILITY OF RIDERS

- 2.1 All competitors must hold a valid MSA competition licence for Cross Country Mcycles & Quads / Enduro
- 2.2 Only **PAID UP** CSMX club members will score points in this championship.

3. AIM OF THE CHAMPIONSHIP

The CSMX Club Committee at its sole discretion shall declare the winners of the 2023 Club Championship in the following classes. The Committee is entitled to withhold such declaration, should circumstances warrant such action:

- **E1/200cc Class**
- **E2/Open Class**
- **Senior Class**
- **Masters Class**
- **High School Class**
- **High School Pro Class**
- **Silver Class**
- **Ladies Class**
- **Social Class**

4. CLASSES

4.1 E1/200cc Class

Motorcycles 2-stroke from 125cc – 200cc and 4-strokes from 150cc – 250cc
Open to riders from the year of their 16th birthday and older
3HRS FOLLOW THE Gold Loop

4.2 E2/Open Class

Motorcycles 2-stroke over 201cc and 4-stroke: over 251cc
Open to riders from the year of their 18th birthday and older
3HRS FOLLOW THE Gold Loop

4.3 Senior Class

Unrestricted capacity
From the year of their 36th birthday
3HRS FOLLOW THE Gold Loop

4.4 **Masters Class**

Unrestricted capacity
From the year of their 46th birthday
2HRS *FOLLOW THE Gold Loop*

4.5 **High School Class**

Maximum capacity motorcycle of 200cc 2-stroke
Year of their 13th birthday to year of 18th birthday
2 HRS - *FOLLOW THE Silver Loop*

4.6 **High School Pro Class**

Motorcycles of maximum capacity of 200cc 2-stroke and 250cc 4-stroke
Open to riders from the year of their 15th birthday to the year of 18th birthday
3 HRS - *FOLLOW THE Gold Loop*

4.7 **Silver Class**

Restricted capacity as per E1/200cc and E2/Open
From the year of their 16th birthday (open to riders who have not finished in the top ten overall for any preceding year or at discretion of the controllers).
3HRS *FOLLOW THE Silver Loop*

4.8 **Social Class**

Restricted capacity as per 200cc and Open
From year of 15th birthday
2HRS - *FOLLOW THE Silver Loop*

4.9 **Ladies Class**

Restricted capacity as High School, E1/200cc and E2/Open
From year of 13th birthday
All ladies may enter one of the above classes, and then automatically score in the Ladies. Ladies riding the Gold loop will always finish in ahead of Ladies doing the Silver Loop.

4.10 **Only one (1) club class may be entered.**

4.11 For overall position on the Gold Loop, riders will be scored on most laps first and then best times, regardless of whether they are riding in the 3 or 2 hour class (2 hour competitors must stop once given the chequered flag).

7. CLASSES WINNERS AWARDS

- 7.1 Minimum of three (3) competitors per class to announce class winners.
- 7.2 If less than three (3) on average are received, we will not award a champion.

8. ASSISTANCE RENDERED

When a competitor has, with the approval of the organisers, assisted with the organisation/planning of the event, the penalty of exclusion will not apply. A record of the names of the competitors who have “officially” assisted will be kept by the club
