8.1 Please refer to GCR 227 as well as Articles 2, 3 and 21 of the 2024 MSA Northern Regions Off Road Car Racing Circular (hereinafter referred to as MSA N. Regions O.R. Regulations).

9 COMPETITOR CONDUCT

9.1 Competitors' attention is drawn to *GCRs 93, 113, 118, 121, 122, 127* and *138* of the MSA General Competition Rules (hereinafter referred to as GCRs).

10 INJURY REGISTER

10.1 Where a competitor has appeared on the injury register, it is that competitor's responsibility to ensure that they have submitted a medical certificate indicating that they are fit to compete in motorsport no later than 5 (five) working days before the start of the event. This certificate is to be reviewed and processed by MSA Head Office. It is the responsibility of the competitor to check the Injury Register and ensure that MSA receives their letter timeously. *Please Note*: Competing while appearing on the injury register will result in potential claims being repudiated by the MSA Group Accident Policy. *Refer to Appendix L - Article 2.9*

11 ENVIRONMENTAL

18 CREW AND CHANGE OF CREW OR VEHICLE (Refer GCR's 238 & 259 and ART2.3)

18.1 A change of crew or vehicle, but not both, may be permitted by the Clerk of the Course, subject to the approval of the Stewards of the Meeting, in terms of *GCR's 99 (vii), 152 (viii), 238 (i) and 259*. Any application must be made in writing and will only be permitted before the Competitors' Briefing for the Racing Section applied for.

19 GPS & Tracking units (Refer ART 2.8 of the MSA N. Regions O.R. Regulations)

- 19.1 The use of GPS is compulsory for all competitors. Refer ART 2.8
- 19.2 All competitors, whether a finisher or not, must download their GPS on the completion of, or retirement from the race. *Refer ART 2.8.4*
- 19.3 It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that their GPS is compatible with downloads. Refer ART 2.8.1
- 19.4 The use of the tracking unit is compulsory for all competitors. Refer ART 2.10.1

20 SCRUTINEERING

20.1 Self-scrutineering will apply to all competitors. In addition, the Organisers reserve the right to conduct spot checks scrutineering. Refer to ART 3.6. Pre-Event and Post-Event Scrutineering checks may be carried out, should the Clerk of the Course or Stewards deem the same to be necessary. Refer to GCR 17.

21 EVENT FORMAT & INFORMATION

21.1 Administrative Checks / Documentation

Administrative checks will be conducted at the times stipulated in *SR 7.4*. **ALL COMPETITORS** will be required to sign the attendance register during this time and to provide the Race Secretary with an **original, signed** copy of their entry forms *Refer GCR 96*.

Entries that are incomplete in any material respect, *or for which payment has not been received*, will not be published on the entry list or start order and any such entry will not be permitted to start the event before all documentation and payment is complete. *Refer ART's 2.2 & 2.4*.

21.2 Competitors' Briefing

Drivers and Co-Drivers must be present at the time published in SR 7.3 above.

21.3 Electronic Noticeboard

The Organisers will set up an Electronic Noticeboard by way of a WhatsApp Group. Information and instructions published on this group shall be deemed binding on all competitors. The onus rests on the competitor to ensure that he / she joins the Electronic Noticeboard group prior to the start of the event. The link to join the Electronic Noticeboard will be published on the Competitor Portal at <u>www.tiorcsa.info</u> before the event.

In the event of poor / no connectivity at DSP the Organisers will establish a physical noticeboard at Race Control and publish hard copies of starting orders, results, bulletins, etc. The onus is on competitors to check the noticeboard.

21.4 **Qualifying**: Refer ART 9.1 & 9.2 of the MSA N. Regions O.R. Regulations.

- All competitors will be required to complete the Prologue, comprising approximately 25kms, to qualify for their starting position in the Main Race.
- b) The Prologue Start Order, and time intervals, will be determined by the Clerk of the Course in accordance with *ART 9.2.1* of the MSA N. Regions O.R. Regulations.
- c) Non-Finishers of the Prologue Refer ART 9.2.5
- d) Non-Starters of the Prologue Refer ART 9.2.6
- e) Should there not be a finisher within a particular class Refer ART 9.2.7
- f) In the event of two competitors' achieving identical times on prologue, the competitor who is seeded higher will start the Main Race ahead of the other Competitor.

21.5 Racing Section: Refer ART 9.3 of the MSA N. Regions O.R. Regulations

- a) The Racing Section will comprise 2 laps of approximately 125kms each with a Designated Service Point at the end of Lap 1.
- b) Competitors will start the Racing Section in the order established during Prologue and at the intervals determined by the Clerk of the Course with the fastest competitor on Prologue starting first, followed by the second fastest competitor, and so on. Refer *ART 9.3.1*

c) The Clerk of the Course reserves the right to adjust the starting intervals or implement a "Mass Start". *Refer ART 9.3.3.*

d) For calculation of overall time and finishing position, refer ART 9.3.4 & 9.3.5.

21.6 **Designated Service Point (DSP)**

- a) Refuelling: NB The Pit area is a strictly "No Smoking" area. Refer ART 18
- b) Competitors' attention is drawn to GCR 240, the MSA Environmental Code, ART 13 and 14 and ART 18 regarding refuelling regulations.
- c) The use of Environmental Mats during servicing is compulsory. Refer ART 18.3.5. Non-compliance refer ART 20.1.4 (b).
- d) Please note that no hazardous waste (empty fuel/oil containers) may be disposed of in the refuse bins. All empty containers must be removed from the DSP and returned to your premises for disposal. Refer ART 18.3.7. Non-compliance refer ART 20.1.7 (b).
- e) **NO OPEN FIRES** will be permitted in the DSP / Race Headquarters Area at all over the weekend for obvious reasons.

21.7 Classic Club Challenge

a) Classic Club Challenge competitors will complete one lap of the event. Competitors in the Classic Club Challenge will be started at a time and sequence determined by the Clerk of the Course so as not to impede the progress of competitors entered in the regional championship event.

22 FINISH

22.1 The Finish will take the form of a Timed Control at a Stop Control. There will be no "Flying Finish". Competitors will be required to stop as indicated in the Roadbook and their times will only be recorded once the vehicle has come to a stop.

23 SWEEPS AND RECOVERY

23.1 No recovery will be done by the organisers.

24 RESULTS

- 24.1 Refer SR's 7.4 and 7.5 for posting dates and times.
- 24.2 Competitors' attention is drawn to GCR 276.

25 TROPHIES / AWARDS & PRIZE GIVING

- 25.1 The number of trophies per class will be awarded based on the number of entries per class as per SR 22.2, as at the time and date of entries closing, refer SR 7. Late entries will not be taken into account when determining the number of trophies that will be awarded per class.
- 25.26 / More Entries in a class/category at the close of entries1st 3rd place5 Entries in a class/category at the close of entries1st 2nd PlaceLess than 5 entries in a class/category at the close of entries1st Place
- 25.3 Prize Giving will be held in the hall next to the DSP. Prizegiving will be open to all competitors and their service crews. *Right of Admission is reserved as this is a private property.*
- 25.4 The Prize Giving will be followed by a meal offered by the local community. Arrangements and costs for this dinner will be published on the Competitor Portal at <u>www.tiorcsa.info</u> prior to the event.

26 RETIREMENT AND INCIDENT REPORT FORM

Competitors' attention is drawn to ART 19.3 and the fine as stipulated in *ART 20.1.7 (d) and 20.1.8 (b)*. An Online Incident Report Form will be available for completion. The link to the Online Incident Report Form will be published on the competitor portal at <u>www.tiorcsa.info</u> and a link will be posted on the Electronic Notice Board.

27 POSTPONEMENT, ABANDONMENT OR CANCELLATION

The organisers reserve the right to postpone, abandon or cancel the meeting or any part thereof. In the event of any of the above, the competitor/entrant has no right to claim against the Promoter/Organiser in respect of any loss or damage he/she may incur, other than specified in *GCR 244*. The meeting will not be postponed, abandoned, or cancelled without the consent of the MSA Steward in accordance with *GCR 152 & ART 2.4.6*.

28 ADVERTISING

It is a condition of entry that in addition to the advertising referred to in *GCR 246* and *ART 3.1*, competing vehicles shall also display the advertising if any, as stipulated in the Championship Regulations and specifications for the class for which the vehicle is entered.

29 PROTESTS

All protests and appeals will be dealt with as set out in Part IX and X and Appendix R of the MSA GCR's.
