5. STATUS AND DESCRIPTION

FORMAT AND PROCEDURE:

The event forms Round Four of the SA Rally-Raid Championship Super Event Refer SSR 303 [ii] c) ii)

- The format for the event consists of compulsory-scrutineering and electronic documentation, followed by the Falken Wild Peak Prologue of approximately 38 kilometres and Stage 1 of approximately 84 kilometres on Friday, 19 September for SA Rally-Raid Championship Classes Ultimate, Adventurer, Challenger and SSV.
- The race on Saturday, 20 September will comprise Stage 2 and 3 of approximately 178 kilometres each for SA Rally-Raid Championship Classes Ultimate, Adventurer, Challenger and SSV totalling a race distance of approximately 478 kilometres.
- For Eastern Cape Off Road Club the event forms two rounds of the ECORC championship for the cars only. Super Event Refer SSR 303 [ii] c) ii)
- All vehicles must have passed scrutineering
- The format for the event consists of compulsory-scrutineering and electronic documentation, followed by the Falken Wild Peak Prologue of approximately 38 kilometres and Stage 1 of approximately 84 kilometres on Friday, 19 September for ECORC cars only
- The race on Saturday, 20 September will comprise Stage 2 of approximately 100 kilometres for ECORC cars only totalling a race distance of approximately 100 kilometres.
- No refuelling will be allowed on Stage 1 or Stage 2
- Entering the pits for any assistance on Stage 1 or Stage 2 will incur a 10 hour, outside assistance, penalty.
 Refer 311[v].

6. THE QUALIFYING RACE: Refer SSR 307, 310 and 314

- All competitors must complete documentation formalities electronically by no later than Friday, 5
 September 2025.
- The Qualifying Race for the event will commence as per SR 8 to establish a Starting Order for the Outeniqua 400 Round Four, on Friday, 19 September 2025. The Qualifying Race starting order will be established by the CEO of the SA Rally-Raid Championship, the COC and the Timing and Tracking Manager and based on the national seeding system after Round Three the 2025 Ingo Vaal 400.
- Competitors will be started as per the start list in two-minute intervals. There will be no groups and no time gaps. The starting gap between competitors is subject to change by the COC should conditions warrant it.
- Every SA Rally-Raid competing vehicle must have their RallySafe system and GPS activated prior to the start of the Qualifying Race. Refer SR8.
- NB: RallySafe units MUST be powered up at ALL times. This permits the organisers to issue start times efficiently and ensure that start times are received timeously.
 - If the unit is turned off, you will not receive the start time timeously which creates numerous administration issues and possible late starts.
- Physical checking on the line will NOT take place unless there is an issue.
- It is the competitors' responsibility to ensure their start time is displayed on the screen.
- Competitors who did NOT finish the Qualifying Race and are NOT intending to do the main race must return their RallySafe unit to Race HQ after the Qualifying Race. Refer SSR 318 A [xii] a)
- Should a download be required, you will be contacted by the COC, CRO or the Timing and Tracking Manager.
- On-board Camera System. Refer Part 2 art 12.1.2 and 12.2.1. It is the competitors' responsibility to ensure their memory card is installed and operational during the event.
- ECORC competitors will start behind the last SARRC starter in a starting order to be established by ECORC.

7. THE MAIN RACE: Refer SSR's 307, 310 and 314

- SA Rally-Raid competitors will start Round Four Stage 1 on Friday, 19 September in two-minute intervals from the Start/Finish line in the classification order established in the Qualifying Race. The start orders and start times will be published in a start list as per SR 8 & SSR 307, [iii] a)
 - The top ten (10) drivers in the Qualifying Race will choose their start positions for Stage 1 of the Outeniqua 400 on Friday, 19 September in a draw, with the tenth classified driver having first choice, then the ninth and so on. Start positions may be knocked up or down by subsequent driver choices.
 - The starting gap between competitors may be changed by the COC if conditions warrant it.
- On completion of Stage 1 on Friday , 19 September all competitors must report directly to the Parc Fermé.
 Refer SSR 310 [iii] and GCR 252 i), ii), iii). ONLY DRIVER AND NAVIGATOR PERMITTED
- Incidents: Electronic incident report forms are compulsory and available from the link on the Telegram virtual notice board. These must be completed before the stipulated cut off time on Friday, 19 September and Saturday, 20 September. Refer SSR 317 [iii]. Racing incidents between competitors should be reported directly to the CRO or CoC no later than thirty (30) minutes after arrival at final Parc Fermé. Ref GCR 200 [vii].
- On Saturday, 20 September competitors will start Stage 2 in the position attained and published on Friday,
 19 September.
- A thirty-minute (30) compulsory service stop at the DSP will be implemented after Stage 2 on Saturday, 20 September for all competitors. Refer SSR 310 [ii].
 - Competitors will exit DSP from the start/finish arch in the position they finished Stage two, on the time indicated on the timecard.
 - Please ensure you are in position and ready for the RallySafe countdown in accordance with the thirty-minute (30) decontrolled service break.
 - Late out of DSP is added to Stage 3 race time. No compensation for late out of DSP.
- All SA Rally-Raid competitors are to ensure that their RallySafe system, GPS and on-board camera is activated and ready for the ensuing race. Refer 300 [x] and 310 [i] e).
 - NB: RallySafe units MUST be powered up at ALL times. This permits the organisers to issue restart times efficiently and ensure that start times are received timeously.
 - If the unit is turned off, you will not receive the restart time timeously which creates numerous administration issues.
- Physical checking on the line will NOT take place unless there is an issue.
 It is the competitors' responsibility to ensure their start time is displayed on the screen.
- On-board Camera System to be activated. Refer Part 2 art 12.1.2 and 12.2.1. It is the competitors' responsibility to ensure their memory card is installed and operational during the event.
- The leading competitors in all classes will be shown the chequered flag on completion of the event, however, they will not necessarily be the winners of the event.
- Competitors will be classified as per SSR 307 [iii] a)
- The time bar may be changed by the COC of the event. Refer SSR 307 [vi].
- Competitors who did NOT finish the event must return their RallySafe unit to Race HQ as soon as possible after retiring from the event. Refer SSR 318 A [xii] a)
- All competitors, whether a finisher or not must return their RallySafe units to Race HQ after the event.
 Refer SSR 317 [iii] d)
 - Should a download be required, you will be contacted by the COC, CRO or the Tracking Manager.
- **ECORC:** On Friday, 19 September competitors will start Stage 1 behind the last SARRC starter, from the Start/Finish line in the classification order established in the Qualifying Race.
 - The starting gap between competitors may be changed by the COC if conditions warrant it.
- On Saturday, 20 September competitors will start Stage 2 in the position attained in Stage 1, behind the last SARRC competitor and as published in the ECORC classifications on Friday, 19 September.

11. RULE MONITORING

- Specialist trained Marshals will be deployed to monitor rule transgressions during the event. SARR cameras, drones and in-car cameras, GPS and RallySafe, but not limited to, may be used. Refer SSR 300 [x] b; SSR 305 [ii] a), SSR 318 A [ii], [iii] c). The following, but not limited to, may be checked:
- To record the start and all road and rail crossings, shortcutting and exhaust fire-spitting to ensure compliance by all competitors. Refer SSR 309 and SSR 318 A [iii] c), [iv] b), and Part 2 art 4.
- To observe whether the white and yellow lights of vehicles are functioning. Refer SSR 313 and SSR 318 A [v]
 a) and A [viii] b)

- To observe wilful damage to property and competitor and service crew conduct/behaviour.
 Refer SSR 317 [v] and SSR 318 C)
- To observe use of outside assistance. Refer SSR 311.

12. ELIGIBILITY AND PRE-START REQUIREMENTS

COMPETITORS

- All competitors must comply with and acquaint themselves with GCR 121, GCR 122 and SSR 300.
- Crews holding competition licenses from countries other than South Africa, will be accepted according to FIA International Sporting Code Art 2.3.8
- The RallySafe system is compulsory for all SA Rally-Raid National events and must be activated for the duration of the event.

- <u>ECORC</u> It is Mandatory for all ECORC Competitors to download and activate the Life 360 App on their Mobile Phones and carry their mobile phones with them thought the event. This is being introduced to ensure enhanced monitoring and safety

20. GENERAL

- Entries open immediately and close as per SR 8 by which time FULLY COMPLETED ENTRY FORMS
 ACCOMPANIED BY THE PRESCRIBED FEE must be in the hands of the Organisers. Entries not accompanied by
 the entry fee, or which are incomplete in any material aspect will be notified that their entry will be held by
 the organisers, but not processed, until correctly completed and/or the entry fee has been paid in full.
- ALL EVENT DOCUMENTATION MUST BE SUBMITTED ELECTRONICALLY BY NO LATER THAN FRIDAY, 5
 SEPTEMBER AND MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:
- MSA Competition License for Driver, Navigator and Entrant if applicable
- Proof of entry payment
- The Organisers reserve the right to limit the number of entries to a maximum of 120.
 Refer: GCR 101 and 103. Entries will be accepted on a basis of 'first come, first served' and in accordance with SSR 300 [vi] a).
- Should a competitor be uncertain as to whether he/she will be able to compete, he/she should nevertheless submit an entry together with the prescribed entry fee. Should he/she be unable to compete, he/she must inform the Organisers in writing by no later than the start time of the compulsory competitors briefing. If

- the organisers are in receipt of such a letter, they will refund the entry fee in full. Should no withdrawal be received prior to this time the entry fee will be forfeited in full.
- Competitors and Officials are reminded of GCR 118 and GCR 130 re the consumption of alcohol. No alcohol
 maybe consumed at Marshal points or Race HQ while on duty and competitors only after the completion of
 the days racing, and until such time the final results are confirmed. Should you not obey this instruction the
 relevant rules and penalties will be applied.

21. COMPETITION LICENCES

- All competitors that participate in the event, need to have purchased the relevant MSA Competition licence for the class that s/he will be competing in.
- Any competitor without the correct licence, WILL NOT be permitted to compete at the event Please note
 that there is a penalty which may be implemented on the Promoters/Organisers should any competitor
 participate with an invalid or incorrect licence.
- NO LICENCES WILL BE AVAILABLE/PROCESSED ON RACE DAY.

22. ENTRANTS LICENCE

23. INJURY REGISTER

 they have submitted a medical certificate indicating that they are fit to compete in motorsport no later than
 5 (Five) working days before the start of the event. This certificate is to be reviewed and processed by MSA
 Head Office.
- It is the responsibility of the competitor to check the Injury Register and ensure that MSA receives their letter timeously. Please Note: Competing while appearing on the injury register will result in potential claims being repudiated by the MSA Group Accident Policy. Refer to Appendix L Article 2.9

28. COMPETITORS' BRIEFING

SA Rally-Raid Competitors briefing will take place under the Start/Finish Arch for all Competitors on Friday.
 Only driver and navigator to attend.

Competitors briefing information will be published as a bulletin on the Virtual Notice Board after the briefing.

29. PIT ACCESS, DESIGNATED SERVICE POINT, ALLOCATION AND REFUELLING

DSP PARKING:

Each SA Rally-Raid National entry will be issued with a maximum of Four vehicle access passes for the duration of the race weekend. NO extra passes will be issued.

ECORC

Each ECORC entry will be issued with a maximum of two vehicle access passes for the duration of the race weekend. NO extra passes will be issued.

- Pit access will only be granted to vehicles displaying the DSP ACCESS stickers.
- TRAILER PARK:

The trailer park will be located within easy reach of the DSP.

30. DESIGNATED SERVICE POINT

- The Designated Service Point will be at Louvain Guest Farm
- Please ensure that all team members are familiar with the DSP layout and direction of flow.
- All SA Rally-Raid competitors will be decontrolled after Stage two on Saturday, 20 September for thirty minutes (30) at DSP, for servicing purposes. Refer SSR 310 [ii]

31. PIT ALLOCATION AND CONDITIONS OF USE

- Competitors will be allocated pits. A list of these allocations will be posted on the Virtual Notice Board.
 Competitors are asked to be considerate when setting up in their allocated pit and afford other competitors' adequate space.
- NO PARKING of TRAILERS will be allowed in the INNER pit due to limited space. Please comply with this
 instruction.
 - ALL TRAILERS must be parked in the designated trailer park.
 - Semi-trailers and transporters may park in the pit area under supervision of the Logistics Manager and DSP

Chief Marshal and in accordance with the DSP layout.

Competitors and their support crew vehicles are to obey the pit lane flow direction at all times.
 Refer SSR 303 [iii] & SSR 318 A [iii] d

32. REFUELLING

NB: THE PIT AREA IS A STRICTLY "NO SMOKING" AREA

- Competitors' attention is drawn to GCR 240, MSA Environmental Code Art 13 and 14 and SSR 316 regarding Refuelling Regulations. Attention is drawn specifically to the deployment of fire extinguishers. Refer SSR316 [ii], [iii]. Penalty 30 minutes. Refer SSR 318 A [vi] f).
- Competitors in Group Ultimate are reminded that 102 octane fuel must be ordered and paid for, from Amtec Lubricants, not later than Friday, 5 September. Refer SSR Part 2 art 14 addendum 4
- The use of Environmental Mats during servicing and refuelling is compulsory.
 IN THE CASE OF A CONFIRMED SPILLAGE, A FINE OF R1000.00 (one thousand rand) WILL BE LEVIED AND THE RELEVANT CREW/S WILL HAVE TO CLEAN UP THE SPILLAGE TO THE LANDOWNER'S SATISFACTION AND PAY THE COSTS THEREOF. Refer MSA Environmental Code.
 - Environmental mats will be provided by SA Rally-Raid in the Parc Fermé to be used by cars with visible leaks. The mats will remain the property of SA Rally-Raid.
- Please note that no hazardous waste (empty fuel/oil containers) may be disposed of in the refuse bins. All
 empty containers must be removed from the pits/DSP and returned to your workshop for disposal. Refer
 SSR 316 [iv] and SSR 318 A [xii] f.

33. ENVIRONMENTAL

Refer to the MSA Environmental Code

34. FINISH

The Finish of Round Four the Outeniqua 400 will take the form of a Timed Control. Refer SSR 306 [i].

35. PARC FERMÉ AND POST RACE SCRUTINEERING

Only driver and navigator permitted

- A Parc Fermé in accordance with GCR 252 will be in operation at the end of the Falken Wild Peak Prologue and Main race.
- The Organisers may, at their discretion, carry out post-race scrutineering checks. Refer: GCR 254.
- Technical Inspections may be carried out by the Technical Delegate if required by the COC.
- The Clerk of the Course may issue a written request to the TC to take fuel samples from race vehicles for comparison testing. Refer GCR 240 v)

36. TIME BAR

- The DSP Time Bar as per SR 8 whereafter no competitor will be allowed to commence another Stage. Refer SSR 307 [vii]
- End of Race Time Bar Refer SSR 307 [vi], SR 8
- The organisers could also calculate cut-off times at various Marshal Points and Check Points along the route.
 These cut-off times will be published in a bulletin and posted on the Virtual Notice Board. Competitors, who arrive at these cut-off points after the cut-off times, will be instructed by the Marshal to return to the pits via the most direct route.
- The organisers will not be responsible for sweeping or the medical recovery of any competitor who disregards a Marshals instruction in this regard.

37. SWEEPS AND RECOVERY

- A radio/phone sweep will be conducted of the route and sweep vehicles will be on standby if required to
 pick up stranded crew-members. Competitors are to note that the organisers are not obliged to provide a
 service for the recovery of vehicles or spares although they will endeavour to help where possible.
- Stranded racing vehicles and/or spares may only be recovered once racing has been completed.
 Furthermore, competitors/crews may only proceed onto the racing route after consulting with and obtaining written authority from the COC. Refer: GCR 172 (iv) and (x), SSR 311 and SSR 318 [x] f) and SR 20.

38. COMPETITOR CONDUCT

Your attention is drawn to GCR 113, GCR 172, and the MSA Code of Conduct.

As a MSA Entrant, National or One Event Rally-Raid licence holder, you have acknowledged and accepted all the associated terms and conditions applicable to motorsport in South Africa.

In view of the above and notwithstanding the published information, we wish to focus your attention on two pertinent subjects:

 Behaviour and misdemeanours of any or all persons associated with your entry, be they crew, sponsors, family, guests or associates.

Disrespect to officials, co-competitors, other event patrons, members of the public, and general road users.

Refusal to obey instructions or requests from event officials or authorised agents.

Alcohol Consumption and smoking in the pit area.

These are disciplinary infringements. Refer GCR 172 iv) and x).

SA Rally-Raid officials and MSA will apply a zero-tolerance approach.

2. Social Media and sharing of information

Think before you post.

Nothing you post online is private.

Don't air your dirty washing in public or make derogatory or negative remarks about competitors, officials, volunteers, event organisers, promoters or MSA on social media. If you are disgruntled, address your discontent with the appropriate persons, organisation or MSA.

Before posting sensational images or footage of motorsport incidents, take a step back, consider the consequences and respect the privacy of the individuals, their family and their loved ones.

Refrain from posting personal opinions, comments or unsubstantiated information.

Social Media is a wonderful communications tool but remember – BE RESPONSIBLE!

- Incident Report Forms:

Electronic incident report forms are available from the link on the Telegram virtual notice board. These must be completed daily before the stipulated cut off time. Refer SSR 317 [iii]RETIREMENT: Refer SSR 317 [iv].

- RESPONSIBILITY: Attention is drawn to GCR 113 (xiv) regarding responsibility of persons associated with an entrant.
- Insurance:

The organisers pay a levy on behalf of every competitor towards a Public Liability insurance policy that MSA holds, in the amount of R 50 000 000.00 per claim. Every entrant, competitor, driver or person associated with the entrant who is directly responsible for a claim arising from any accident/incident on the event necessitating a claim against this policy will be liable for the first amount payable (excess) of R 25 000.00 per claim. Refer GCR113 xiv).

39. ROUTE, ROAD AND RAIL CROSSINGS:

- ROAD AND RAIL CROSSINGS: Refer SSR 309 and SSR 318 A [iv] b)
 - Competitors are reminded that it is compulsory to stop at all road/rail crossings.

Major road crossings will be Safety Zones, indicated on RallySafe as well as DN/FN control boards. Refer SSR 309 iii)

- ROUTE: The Organisers have been afforded the privilege of staging this event in the area and are reliant on the goodwill of the local community. Please do not abuse their hospitality. We also rely on the local community to provide manpower to successfully run the event, and we request that you, your crews, family and friends act responsibly in order not to alienate the community in any way.
- Competitors are to keep to the marked route and ensure they do not damage crops, veldt, plantations and natural vegetation.
- The unwritten rule of the road is that livestock and game, which may be encountered en route, have right of
 way at all times. If you kill or cause injury to any animal, the incident must be reported in writing to the first
 official/marshal you encounter.
- Competitors are obliged to stop and render assistance in controlling and extinguishing any fire on the route, whether it is a vehicle or vegetation.
- Passage through Populated Areas will be controlled as neutral zones. Refer 308.
 - Area/s will be indicated by boards, road book and GPS/RallySafe.
- Action will be taken against competitors and/or their service crews, who are found to have travelled on
 private property either before, during, or after the event, and/or travelling on the demarcated racing route,
 without the written permission of the COC.
 - This will be strictly enforced! Refer GCR 113 xiv), GCR 172 (iv) and (x), SSR 311, SSR 318C.
- Crews are to be considerate towards landowners when retrieving stranded vehicles and/or spares from the
 route and are to ensure that damage to cultivated and grazing lands is avoided. Failure to comply will result
 in disciplinary action being taken against the crew concerned. It is important that crews familiarise
 themselves with the MSA Environmental Code in this regard.

Refer GCR 113 xiv), GCR 172(iv) and (x) SSR 318 C [i] a).

• Any competitor who avoids or bypasses obstacles/ramps created in the Spectator Stadium Stage on the route could be penalised in terms of a minor deviation from the route. Refer SSR 318 A [ii] b).

Subject to no protests being received in terms of GCR 200 viii), these classifications will become final 30 minutes later.

• Competitors' attention is drawn to Parts IX and X of the 2025 MSA GCR's regarding protests and appeals.

42. PRIZE GIVING: Refer GCR 121 (ix)

- The Awards Podium for the Qualifying Race and the SA Rally-Raid Classes and Special Awards will be held, at a time to be announced, under the start/finish arch, on Saturday, 20 September.
- SA Rally-Raid Championship Group and Class Awards per round:

Awards for all classes Ultimate (FIA T1+ & SA T1+), Adventurer (SA T1.1 & SA T1.2), Challenger (Classic A; P & T & SA T3.1) and SSV (SxS MSA) will be based on the number of paid entries received at the closing of normal entries on the following basis - 1 to 3 in all classes

- Constructors Award This is not the MSA Constructors Award, this is the on-event award.
 - [i] The Constructors Award will be made to the two (2) highest placed finishers from the same constructor, with the lowest aggregate time, based on the overall results of the event. . For the Overall Constructors Championship, refer SSR 320.
 - [ii] The Constructors manager/representative will be presented with a trophy for the winning Constructor. Constructors are SVR; NWM; Century Racing; Red-Lined and WCT Engineering
- Team of the Event Award
 - [i] This award will be made to the highest placed two (2) vehicles from the same entrant with the lowest aggregate time when added together. In the event of a tie, the team with the highest position finisher will win
 - [ii] In the event there not being two (2) vehicles from one (1) entrant, the award will not be made.
 - [iii] The team entrant/representative will be presented with a team trophy
- FINISHER'S BADGES:

Finishers' badges will be presented to all competitors who are classified as finishers of the event. Refer SSR 307 [i].

Finishers awards to be collected when returning your RallySafe unit after completion of the event. Special Awards may be handed out at the discretion of the Organisers.
