5. ELIGIBILITY OF COMPETITORS

6. INJURY REGISTER

This certificate is to be reviewed and processed by MSA Head Office.

It is the responsibility of the

competitor to check the Injury Register and ensure that MSA receives their letter timeously.

Please Note: Competing while appearing on the injury register will result in potential claims being repudiated by the MSA Group Accident Policy.

7. COMPETITOR CONDUCT

No unattended children are permitted in the venue. The riding of Pit Bikes, Motor Bikes and Bicycles in the pits, other than by competitors is not permitted.

The purpose of the Event is to test the reliability of the motorcycles and the skill of the participating competitor as a combined unit. Where the combined unit, does not traverse the entire route, a penalty of 30 minutes plus time for the advantage gained will be applied at the discretion of the COC.

Pit crew refers to all persons who support a rider e.g., the riders mechanical crew, his family, friends and sponsor and/or entrant, this list is not complete.

INSURANCE:

The organisers pay a levy on behalf of the competitors and officials, towards a Public Liability Policy which is held through MSA.
