REVIEW AND AMENDMENTS

Motorsport South Africa (MSA) will periodically review these rules and will present the revised version to all members for agreement to publish the updated version.

Amendments and updates to the rules will be recorded in the Amendment Record, detailing the updated version, date of approval of the amendment and a short summary of the amendment.

Note: These regulations are to be read in conjunction with the General Competition Rules (GCRs), National Motocross Standing Supplementary Regulations (SSRs) and any applicable circulars of Motorsport South Africa (MSA).

These regulations must be read and understood by all competitors.

In the event that there is any conflict between club, regional and national regulations, the National regulations (2026 MSA SA National Motocross SSRs – Note 7) shall, at all times prevail.

1. VALIDITY OF THE REGULATIONS

Applicable for the calendar year of **2026**.

2. CONTROLLERS OF THE CHAMPIONSHIP

The Controllers of the Championship will be the Bloemfontein Off Road Club.

3. AIM OF THE CHAMPIONSHIP

- a) To declare a BORC Club Motocross Champion in each of the Club classes. The Controllers are responsible for declaring the winners of the Championship and are entitled to withhold such declaration from any competitor.
- b) The Championship year shall run from 1 January 2026 to 31 December 2026.
- c) BORC Club Championship Classes:

MX 50cc JNR
MX 50cc PRO
MX 65cc
MX 85cc /Pro Mini
MX 125 HIGH SCHOOL
B – Stream (Vets, Masters, Ladies, Support)
A – Stream (MX 1 & MX 2)

4. ELIGIBILITY OF COMPETITORS & MOTORCYCLES

- a) The Club Championship is open to all riders who are domiciled in the area under jurisdiction of the MSA Free State/Northern Cape, Northern Regions, **KwaZulu-Natal, Eastern and Western Cape** Regional Motorsport Committees, as permitted in GCR 60.
- b) All eligible riders' motorcycles and licences must comply with **SSR-17 ART 2 of the National Motocross Regulations**.

5. CHAMPIONSHIP EVENTS AND HEATS TO COUNT

- a) **Five (5) events per class are scheduled. The five (5) events will comprise of two (2) heats, totalling ten (10) heats.**
- b) All heats to count for a class to be eligible for BORC Motocross Club Championships.
- c) There are no drop heats in the Championships.

6. CLASSES AND POINT SCORING

- a) All entries MUST appear on all result sheets, even if a rider does not start the 1st heat or does not complete racing for the day.
- b) All competitors must compete in practice and at least one heat to be classified as a starter.
- c) For a BORC Club Championship to be declared, there must be an average of three (3) riders per Club Championship event, namely practice, 1st heat, or 2nd heat.
- d) The average number of riders to be calculated at the end of the Club Championship after all rounds were raced.
- e) Points scoring will be in accordance with the **2026** MSA SA National Motocross SSRs.
- f) Championship scoring will be available on the MSA Website (www.motorsport.co.za)

- g) Classes and Technical Specifications as listed below in SSR 18
- h) If a competitor is riding in a higher status event, already participating in the Club Championship, they will be awarded average points towards the Club Championship to be calculated as an average across all **races**/heats raced for the year. The higher tier race needs to be upon invite of MSA and provided that proof of this selection is forwarded to the relevant regional representative.

7. SEPARATION OF TIES

In the case of a tie at the end of the series, the competitor with the greatest number of firsts will be Champion. If this does not resolve the tie, the greatest number of seconds will count, failing this, thirds and so on. If a tie still remains, performance in all Championship events will be taken into consideration and if this is still ineffective, MSA shall declare the winner on such a basis as it deems fit.

Refer to Art 7 in the **2026** MSA SA National Motocross SSR's.

8. COMPETITION NUMBERS

Competition numbers for ALL classes will be those as issued by Motorsport SA (Head Office) only.
Refer to SSR 221 – 224 in the **2026** MSA SA National Motocross SSRs.

9. PROGRAMME OF EVENTS, RACE DISTANCE AND RACE ORDER

- a) Refer to SRs (Event regulations).
- b) RACE DISTANCE & RACE ORDER (The duration and race order of the event may be altered if deemed necessary by the Clerk of the Course in consultation with the stewards).

The duration of each **race**/heat for the Championship will be:

MX 50cc JNR	5 laps
MX 50cc PRO	10 minutes + 1 lap (2 heats)
MX 65cc	12 minutes + 1 lap (2 heats)
MX 85cc /Pro Mini	12 minutes + 1 lap (2 heats)
MX 125	15 minutes + 1 lap (2 heats)
B - Stream	12 minutes + 1 lap (2 heats)
A - Stream	15 minutes + 1 lap (2 heats)

- c) Gate pick for the 1st **race**/heat of a Club event will be determined by the results of the previous round except for Round 1 The 2nd **race**/heat gate pick will be determined from the first **races**/heats result.

10. POSTPONEMENT, ABANDONMENT OR CANCELLATION OF COMPETITION

In the event of a postponement, abandonment or cancellation of a scheduled meeting or a competition forming part of a meeting, the Organisers reserve the right to apply the applicable below stated provision/s:

- a) Postponement – Should an event be postponed prior to the start of the event, and it is possible to reschedule the event on another date, entries already received/lodged for the postponed event will be reallocated to the rescheduled event. If this is not possible, for any reason, entry fees may be partially or fully refunded.
- b) Abandonment – Once an event has officially started, refer to GCR 31 and 261, and is abandoned due to Force Majeure or safety concerns, no entry fee refunds will be made.
- c) Cancellation – If an event is cancelled for any reason prior to its start, entries will be partially or fully refunded – refer GCR 244.
- d) Also refer to GCR's 62, 152 vii), 156 vi), 244 and 273 ii).

11. SCRUTINEERING

- a) Self-Declaration will apply. Forms will be available via the electronic official notice board.
- b) Refer to SSR 226 in **2026** MSA SA National Motocross SSR's.

12. MULTIPLE CLASSES

- a) Multiple classes are permitted, provided the rider's age and motorcycle conforms.
- b) **Competitors** who compete in an official A stream class, may not also compete in a B Stream class.

13. CLOSURE OF TRACK / VENUE

- a) At the discretion of the hosting club / track, they may close at 18:00 on the Sunday, **one (1)** week prior to the event.
- b) The responsibility for establishing if a track / venue is open lies with competitors.

14. TROPHIES & PRIZEMONEY

The above will be awarded at the discretion of the Promoters / Organisers **as laid out in the event SRs.**

15. INTERPRETATION OF RULES

Apart from the above specified rules for BORC Club Motocross Events, the rules as contained in the **2026 MSA SA National Motocross SSR's** apply.

16. ENTRIES

Entry fees for 2026 can be seen in the **event** SR's (Event regulations).

17. FIRE EXTINGUISHER, ENVIRONMENTAL MATS & SOUND LEVELS

Refer to 2026 MSA SA National Motocross SSR's.

18. CLASSES AND TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS — Refer to SSP 3

- a) **50cc JNR** – 2-stroke (Water cooled motorcycles not exceeding 52cc)
Competitors requires **the minimum of a valid MSA** Club MX licence
Age – Open to riders from the year of their 4th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 9th birthday occurs.
Please note that the age for female competitors will be from the year of their 4th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 10th birthday occurs.
Wheel size - Rear 10" and Front 12"
- b) **50cc PRO** – 2-stroke (Water cooled motorcycles not exceeding 52cc)
Competitors requires **the minimum of a valid MSA** Club MX licence
Age – Open to riders from the year of their 4th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 9th birthday occurs.
Please note that the age for female competitors will be from the year of their 4th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 10th birthday occurs.
Carburettor size – 19mm as per the motorcycle manufacturers specifications (stock)
Wheel size - Rear 10" and Front 12"
- c) **MX 65cc** - (Clutch lever motorcycles not exceeding 65cc.)
Competitors requires **the minimum of a valid MSA** Club MX licence
Age – Open to riders from the year of the 7th birthday to 31 December of the year in which 12th their birthday occurs.
Please note that the age for female competitors will be from the year of their 7th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 13th birthday occurs.
Wheel size – Rear 12" and Front 14"
- d) **MX 85cc Pro Mini**
Competitors require **the minimum of a valid MSA** Club MX licence
Clutch lever motorcycles not exceeding 85cc 2-stroke and 150cc 4-stroke.
Age – Open to riders from the year of their 10th birthday to the 31st of December of the year in which their 14th birthday occurs.
Please note that the age for female competitors will be from the year of their 10th birthday to the 31st of December of the year in which their 15th birthday occurs.
Wheel size – Rear 14" and Front 17" or Rear 16" and Front 19".
The only restriction on engines in this class will be the bore and stroke to capacity **as stated** . No further restrictions will apply.
Licence required is a minimum of a MSA Club Motocross Licence

e) **MX 125 HIGH SCHOOL**

Competitors require **the minimum of a valid MSA** Club MX licence

Age – Open to riders from the year of their 13th birthday to the 31st December of the year in which they turn 18th birthday occurs, who are permitted to compete on motorcycles of a capacity of 105cc 2-stroke and wheel size of Rear 16" and Front 19";

Age – Open to riders from the year of their 13th birthday to the 31st December of the year in which their 18th birthday occurs, who are permitted to compete on motorcycles of a capacity not exceeding 126cc 2-stroke and wheel size of Rear 18" / 19" and Front 21"

f) **A-Stream (MX 1 & MX 2)**

Competitors require **the minimum of a valid MSA** Club MX licence

Age – Open to riders from the year of the 16th birthday and older.

MX125 riders can score for Championship if entered.

Wheel size – Rear 19" / 18" and Front 21"

Engine capacity 125cc 2-stroke - 300cc 2-stroke & 250cc 4-stroke - 450cc 4-stroke motorcycles.

g) **B-Stream (Vets, Masters, Ladies, Support)**

Competitors require **the minimum of a valid MSA** Club MX licence

Wheel Size – Rear 19" / 18" and Front 21"

Open to riders from the year of their 30th birthday and older (125cc-150cc 2 stroke & 250cc 4 stroke motorcycles), (125cc 2-stroke - 300cc 2-stroke & 250cc 4-stroke - 450cc 4-stroke motorcycle) The Championship scoring would be combined however for the final prizegiving, classes will be divided as per category. No bonus points would be allocated on the day ~~in the~~ for any rider, or in the Championship classes. Class to include the following categories:

- Ladies class - Open to riders from the year of their 10th birthday. These riders can compete on Motorcycles not exceeding 125cc 2-stroke, or 150cc 4-stroke.
- Open to riders from the year of their 15th birthday. These riders can compete on Motorcycles not exceeding 150 2-stroke or 250cc 4-stroke
- Vets Class – Open to riders from the year of the riders 35th ~~birthday to the age of the riders 39th birthday as at the end of 31st December 2026.~~
- Master's Class – Open to riders from the year of the riders 50th birthday ~~to the age of 49th birthday as at the end of 31st December 2026.~~
- Grandmaster Class – Open to riders from the year of the riders 50th birthday and older.
- MX Intermediate – Open to riders from the year of their 13th birthday and older
- No MX125 riders **are** permitted

Unless otherwise stated, classes may be combined but will score separately.

It is important to note the requirements and allowances of SSR 248 in the 2026 MSA SA National Motocross SSR's.
