REVIEW AND AMENDMENTS

ANY proposed / desired changes to these Championship Regulations must be submitted to the Controllers for approval. The Controllers reserve the right to introduce new Regulations and / or amend existing Regulations with the approval of Motorsport South Africa (MSA).

Amendments and updates to the rules will be recorded in the Amendment Record, detailing the updated version, date of approval of the amendment and a short summary of the amendment. The new version of the rules will be published by MSA at least seven (7) days prior to the next event being held unless a shorter notice period is approved by MSA. (Refer GCR 67)

All race meetings shall be held under the 2026 General Competition Rules (GCRs), Standing Supplementary Regulations (SSRs) of Motorsport South Africa (MSA), these Club Regulations, the event Supplementary Regulations (SRs) and any applicable MSA Circulars. In the event that the Club Rules are silent, the National Rules shall, at all times prevail.

1. **CONTROLLERS**

Western Cape Off Road Club (WCOC) Committee, under the authority of Motorsport South Africa and in compliance with the MSA General Competition Rules and these Standing Supplementary Regulations.

2. **ELIGIBILITY OF RIDERS**

- 2.1 All competitors must hold a valid MSA competition licence for Cross Country Mcycles & Quads / Enduro with a minimum of club status except for the Social class which only requires a minimum of a one event Social licence.
- 2.2 Refer to SSR 325 in the 2026 MSA National Cross Country Motorcycles & Quads SSRs.
- 2.3 Only **PAID UP** WCOC club members will score points in these Championships.

3. **AIM OF THE CHAMPIONSHIP**

The WCOC Club Committee at its sole discretion shall declare the winners of the 2026 Club Championship in the following classes. The Committee is entitled to withhold such declaration, should circumstances warrant such action:

- Junior 65cc
- 85cc
- High School
- 200cc (OR3)
- Open (OR1 & OR2)
- Seniors
- Masters
- Ladies

4. **CLASSES**

4.1 **PW50cc – 110cc - Non Championship Class, Participation trophies for places 1st – 3rd at each event**

a) **Junior PW50cc**

Open to riders from the year of their 5th birthday, to 31 December of the year in which their 9th birthday occurs.

Please note that the age for female competitors will be from the year of their 5th birthday, to 31 December of the year in which their 10th birthday occurs.

Motorcycles – PW50cc auto clutch

Ride for sixty (60) minutes and have a sighting lap.

b) **Junior 50cc**

Open to riders from the year of their 5th birthday, to 31 December of the year in which their 9th birthday occurs.

Please note that the age for female competitors will be from the year of their 5th birthday, to 31 December of the year in which their 10th birthday occurs.

Motorcycles – 50cc auto clutch.

Ride for sixty (60) minutes and have a sighting lap.

4.2 Junior 65cc

Open to riders from the year of their 7th birthday, to 31 December of the year in which their 12th birthday occurs.

Please note that the age for female competitors will be from the year of their 7th birthday, to 31 December of the year in which their 13th birthday occurs.

Motorcycles with a maximum permissible capacity of 65cc 2-stroke, 85cc auto or 110cc 4-stroke.

Minimum and maximum wheel size 12" rear and 14" front.

Ride for two (2) hours.

4.3 85cc Motorcycles (Senior 85cc and Junior 85cc classes combined):

4.3.1. Senior 85cc Motorcycles – The maximum permissible capacity is 85cc 2-stroke or 150cc 4-stroke. (Minimum wheel size 14" rear 17" front, Maximum 16" rear and 19" front).

Open to competitors from the year of their 12th birthday, to 31st December of the year in which their 15th birthday occurs.

Please note that the age for female competitors will be from the year of their 12th birthday, to 31 December of the year in which their 16th birthday occurs.

4.3.2 Junior 85cc Motorcycles – The maximum permissible capacity is 85cc 2-stroke or 125cc 4-stroke air cooled. (Minimum wheel size 14" rear 17" front, Maximum 16" rear and 19" front). Open to competitors from the year of their 8th birthday, to 31st December of the year in which their 13th birthday occurs.

Please note that the age for female competitors will be from the year of their 8th birthday, to 31 December of the year in which their 14th birthday occurs.

4.4 High School

Open to riders from the year of their 13th birthday, to 31 December of the year of their 18th birthday.

Motorcycle capacity - engine capacity not to exceed 125cc 2-stroke.

Wheel size 21" front and 18" / 19" rear.

Ride for three (3) hours.

4.5 200cc (OR3)

Open to riders from the year of their 16th birthday and older.

Motorcycle capacity – 2-stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity not exceeding 201cc and 4-stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity not exceeding 251cc.

Wheel size of 21" front and 18" / 19" rear.

Ride for three (3) hours.

4.6 Open (OR1 & OR2)

Open to competitors from the year of their 18th birthday and older.

Any capacity motorcycles may be used.

Wheel size of 21" front and 18" / 19" rear

Ride for three (3) hours.

4.7 Senior

Open to riders from the year of their 36th birthday and older.

Any capacity motorcycle may be used.

Wheel size 21" front and 18" / 19" rear.

Ride for three (3) hours.

4.8 Masters

Open to riders from the year of their 46th birthday and older.

Any capacity motorcycle may be used.

Wheel size 21" front and 18" / 19" rear.

Ride for three (3) hours.

4.9 Ladies

- Open to competitors from the year of their 13th birthday to the year of their 15th birthday on a two stroke motorcycle with an engine capacity not exceeding 125cc or a four (4) stroke motorcycle with an engine capacity not exceeding 150cc.
- Open to competitors from the year of their 16th birthday and older on any capacity motorcycle.

Ride for three (3) hours.

4.10 Social - Non Championship Class, Participation trophies

When competing as a social rider engine capacity and age restrictions as per the above classes still apply.

Bikes up to 85cc will start behind the Jnr Club classes.

Bikes from 125cc will start behind the Snr Club classes.

A minimum of a **valid MSA** Social Licence required.

Ride for two (2) hours.

Social non-championship riders may make use of the social licence and one event social licence will be available for the event. This will however have to be purchased online prior to the event

4.11 Ladies Intro Bikes - Non Championship Class, Participation trophies

Age 10 years and older.

Bike capacity and age restriction as per Club class restrictions

Non championship class with a minimum of a **valid MSA social licence required.**

Ride for two (2) hours.

4.12 Quads (Junior and Senior)

Senior Quads - Q1 Quads:

The maximum capacity 350cc 2-stroke/450cc 4-stroke.

The Maximum speed permitted is 130km/h

Open to competitors from the year of their 16th birthday.

Social non-championship class. The minimum of a valid MSA Social licence for Cross Country Quads is required. The licence has to be purchased online via msaonline.co.za prior to the event.

Junior Quads - Junior Open Quads:

The maximum capacity 200cc 2-stroke/250cc 4-stroke

The Maximum speed permitted is 130km/h

Open to competitors from the year of their 14th birthday to the year of their 17th birthday.

Social non-championship class. The minimum of a valid MSA Social licence for Cross Country Quads is required. The licence has to be purchased online via msaonline.co.za prior to the event.

5. RESERVED

6. **CHAMPIONSHIP EVENTS**

The Club Championship will consist of five (5) events of which all five (5) events will count towards the Championship.

7. **POINT SCORING**

1 st	-	25 points	2 nd	-	22 points
3 rd	-	20 points	4 th	-	18 points

All those competitors who finish in a position lower than 20th will receive one (1) point.

Any ties will be in favour of the competitor with the greater number of firsts. If this fails, the greater number of seconds will count, then thirds and so on and progressing down the finishing positions in all of the events held as part of the Championship until the tie is broken. If the tie still remains, the competitors will be declared to be joint winners/champions.

8. **CLASSES WINNERS AWARDS**

8.1 Minimum of three (3) competitors per class to announce class winners.

8.2 If less than three (3) on average are received, we will not recognise a Champion in that class.

9. **SERVICE CREWS / OUTSIDE ASSISTANCE**

Refer to SSR 343 2026 MSA National Cross Country Motorcycles & Quads SSRs.

10. **PENALTIES**

10.1 Any parent not acting in the best interest of their child racing at any event, will cause their child to be excluded from the results and / or refused permission to continue with the race after such incident and may be banned from competing in future events. See SSR 346 h) i) and SSR 351 g) xxviii).

10.2 If any penalties or exclusions are applied, all possible steps will be taken to inform the competitor(s), prior to the posting of provisional results.

10.3 The Clerk of the Course in consultation with the Chief Medical Officer will have the right to stop a competitor from further competing at any event for safety or medical reasons. Time compensation, if held up unnecessarily, will be afforded to the affected competitor by the Clerk of the Course, at his / her discretion.

- 10.4 The penalty for speeding in the pit lane (exceeding walking pace)– refer to SSR 351.b.ii of the 2026 MSA National Cross Country Motorcycles & Quads SSRs.
- 10.5 Stopping to check on an injured rider during the race. Refer to 2026 National Cross Country Motorcycle SSR 346 c) i) and SSR 346d) i).
- 10.6 Should a competitor be caught not pulling off, when safe to do so for another rider, the said competitor will be penalized as per SSR 346 f) iii) of the 2026 MSA National Cross Country Motorcycles & Quads SSRs.
- 10.7 All riders are to wear protective gear, including helmet, goggles, gloves and adequate boots, long pants and chest protector whenever entering the track. No rider is permitted to ride a motorcycle without at least a helmet on in the pit area. Exclusion and fine to be applied. See SSR 351).

11. CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOL

It is forbidden for any competitor to consume alcohol while taking part in an event, or in the time period between a competitor completing an event and the relevant race officials at the event giving a decision on any protest that he / she may have lodged. Offenders shall be excluded from the event and shall be reported to MSA for possible further action **should they consume alcohol during this period**. Likewise, action may be taken against any competitor where persons associated with him / her **who are found in contravention of GCR 173** and/or cause unnecessary problems for the race officials as a result of being under the influence of alcohol.

12. GENERAL

- 12.1 Social licence holders are not eligible to score points towards any Club Championships-
- 12.2 All members are to look after their floating trophies and return them at the last race of the year, in the condition that they were received. Penalty fees are applicable before acceptance of membership or entry allowed to a race should a floating trophy be outstanding.
- 12.3 All riders under the age of eighteen (18) are to have a parent or guardian in attendance at all times.
- 12.4 All club members are allowed a discounted entry fee structure for race days and non- members are to pay a higher entry fee.
- 12.5 If a competitor in the Ladies Intro Class is placed in the top three (3) in her class for two (2) consecutive years she will need to upgrade in the following year to a more competitive class these will be based on overall times that is used for Starting orders.
