5. STATUS AND DESCRIPTION

- **FORMAT AND PROCEDURE:**
- The event forms Round Two of the SA Rally-Raid Championship for Classes Ultimate, Adventurer, Challenger and SSV.
Marathon Event Refer SSR 303 [i] & [ii] c) [iii]
- The format for the event consists of compulsory-scrutineering and electronic documentation, followed by the Qualifying race of approximately 10 kilometres and stage 1 of approximately 30 kilometres on Friday, 24 July for the SA Rally-Raid Championship.
- The race on Saturday, 25 July will comprise stage 2 of approximately 225 kilometres and stage 3 of approximately 225 kilometres for the SA Rally-Raid Championship.
- Racing on Sunday, 26 July will comprise stage 4 of approximately 200 kilometres and stage 5 of approximately 200 for the SA Rally-Raid Championship, , totalling a race distance of approximately 860 Kilometres.
- **Northern Regions Invitation**
- The event is a non-scoring invitation race for cars only and does not form any round of the Northern Regions Championship.
- The format for the event consists of compulsory-scrutineering and electronic documentation, followed by the Qualifying race of approximately 10 kilometres and stage 1 of approximately 30 kilometres on Friday, 24 July.
- The race on Saturday, 25 July will comprise stage 2 of approximately 225 kilometres
- The race on Sunday, 26 July will comprise stage 4 of approximately 200 kilometres, for Northern Regions Invitation Classes **Specials Category** Classes A, P & B; **Production Category** Classes T, S, D & E; **Lightweight Category** belt driven SXS no sequential gears; **FIA Big Wheel** FIA Ultimate T1+, T1.2+ & CanAm Maverick R and **FIA Small Wheel** all other FIA cars.

6. THE QUALIFYING RACE: Refer SSR 307, 310 and 314

- **All** competitors must complete documentation formalities electronically by no later than Friday, 10 July 2026.
RALLYSAFE AND ON-BOARD CAMERA SYSTEMS
Every **SA Rally-Raid** competing vehicle must have their RallySafe system and GPS activated prior to the start of the Qualifying race and main races. Refer SR8
- **NB: RallySafe units MUST be powered up at ALL times during the entire event.**
This permits the organisers to issue restart times efficiently and ensure that start times are received timeously.
If the unit is turned off, you will not receive the restart time timeously which creates numerous administration issues.
- Physical checking on the line will NOT take place unless there is an issue.
It is the competitors' responsibility to ensure their start time is displayed on the screen.
- **On-board Camera System to be activated.** Refer Part 2 art 12.1.1.5, 12.1.2.6 and 12.2.1.6 It is the competitors' responsibility to ensure the memory card is installed and operational during the event.
- The leading competitors in all classes will be shown the chequered flag on completion of the event, however, they will not necessarily be the winners of the event.
- Competitors will be classified as per SSR 307 [iii] a)
- The time bar may be changed by the COC of the event. Refer SSR 307 [vi].
- Competitors who DID NOT finish the qualifying race or ANY STAGE of the event and are NOT intending to COMPLETE the balance of the event must return their RallySafe unit to Race HQ as soon as possible after retiring from the event. Refer SSR 318 A [xii] a)
- All competitors, whether they finish or not must return their RallySafe units to Race HQ after the event. Refer SSR 317 [iii] d)
Should a download be required, you will be contacted by the COC, CRO or the Tracking Manager.
- **Northern Regions invitation**
- **2026 Northern Regions SSR 2.8 GPS, tracking & screamers**

- The Qualifying race for the event will commence as per SR 8 to establish a Starting Order for the **GR 1000 MARATHON** Round Two, on Friday, 24 July 2026. The Qualifying race starting order will be established by the CEO of the SA Rally-Raid Championship, the COC and the Timing and Tracking Manager and based on the national seeding system after Round One of the 2026 SARRC, the INGCO Parys 400.
- Competitors will be started as per the start list in two-minute intervals. There will be no groups and no time gaps. The starting gap between competitors is subject to change by the COC should conditions warrant it.
- Every SA Rally-Raid competing vehicle must have their RallySafe system and GPS activated prior to the start of the Qualifying race. Refer SR8.
- **Northern Regions Invitation** competitors will start behind the last SARRC starter in a starting order to be established by **Northern Regions seeding list**.
- **Northern Regions Invitation** competitors to affix day glow orange decal, supplied by SARR, below the specified Marsal Panel

7. THE MAIN RACE: Refer SSR's 307, 310 and 314

- SA Rally-Raid competitors will start Round Two stage 1 on Friday, 24 July in two-minute intervals from the Start/Finish line in the classification order established in the Qualifying race. The start orders and start times will be published in a start list as per SR 8 & SSR 307, [iii] a)
The top ten (10) drivers in the Qualifying race will choose their start positions for stage 1 of the **GR 1000 MARATHON** on **Friday, 24 July** in a draw, with the tenth classified driver having first choice, then the ninth and so on. Start positions may be knocked up or down by subsequent driver choices.
The starting gap between competitors may be changed by the COC if conditions warrant it.
- On **Saturday, 25 July** competitors will start stage 2 in the overall position attained and published on Friday, 24 July.
- A thirty-minute (30) compulsory service stop at the DSP will be implemented after stage 2 on Saturday, 25 July for all SARR competitors. Refer SSR 310 [ii].
Competitors will exit DSP from the start/finish arch in the position they finished stage 2, on the time indicated on RallySafe.
Please ensure you are in position and ready for the RallySafe countdown in accordance with the thirty-minute (30) decontrolled service break.
Late out of DSP is added to stage 3 race time. No compensation for late out of DSP.

- On **Sunday, 26 July** competitors will start stage 4 in the overall position attained and published on Saturday, 25 July.
- A thirty-minute (30) compulsory service stop at the DSP will be implemented after stage 4 on Sunday, 26 July for all SARR competitors. Refer SSR 310 [ii].
Competitors will exit DSP from the start/finish arch in the position they finished stage 4, on the time indicated on RallySafe.
Please ensure you are in position and ready for the RallySafe countdown in accordance with the thirty-minute (30) decontrolled service break.
Late out of DSP is added to stage 4 race time. No compensation for late out of DSP.
- All SA Rally-Raid competitors are to ensure that their RallySafe system, GPS and on-board camera is activated and ready for the ensuing race. Refer 300 [x] and 310 [i] e).
The starting gap between competitors may be changed by the COC if conditions warrant it.
- **On completion of stage 1 on Friday, 24, stage 3 on Saturday 25 and stage 5 Sunday 26 July all competitors must report directly to the Parc Fermé.**
Refer SSR 310 [iii] and GCR 252 i), ii), iii).
- **Incidents:** Electronic incident report forms are compulsory and available from the link on the Sportity virtual notice board. These must be completed before the stipulated cut off time on Friday, 24 Saturday, 25 and Sunday 26 July. Refer SSR 317 [iii]. Racing incidents between competitors should be reported directly to the CRO or CoC no later than thirty (30) minutes after arrival at final Parc Fermé.
Ref GCR 200 [vii].
- **Northern Region Invitation:** On Friday, 24 July competitors will start stage 1 behind the last SARRC starter, from the Start/Finish line in the classification order established in the Qualifying race.
The starting gap between competitors may be changed by the COC if conditions warrant it.
On Saturday, 25 July competitors will start stage 2 in the position attained in stage 1, behind the last SARRC competitor and as published in the Northern Regions Invitation classifications on Friday 24 July.
On Sunday, 26 July competitors will start stage 4 in the position attained in stage 2, behind the last SARRC competitor and as published in the Northern Regions Invitation classifications on Saturday 25 July.

- The Organisers reserve the right to limit the number of entries to a maximum of 120.
Refer: GCR 101 and 103. Entries will be accepted on a basis of 'first come, first served' and in accordance with SSR 300 [vi] a).
- Should a competitor be uncertain as to whether he/she will be able to compete, he/she should nevertheless submit an entry together with the prescribed entry fee. Should he/she be unable to compete, he/she must inform the Organisers in writing by no later than the start time of the compulsory competitors briefing. If the organisers are in receipt of such communicate, they will refund the entry fee in full. Should no withdrawal be received prior to this time the entry fee will be forfeited in full.
- Competitors and Officials are reminded of GCR 118 and GCR 130 re the consumption of alcohol. 22. ENTRANTS LICENCE

- Where the entrant is NOT the competitor, an entrant's licence must be obtained from MSA and submitted together with the event documentation, failing which, the entrants name WILL NOT be published on the event entry list.

23. INJURY REGISTER

- Where a competitor has appeared on the injury register, it is that competitor's responsibility to ensure that they have submitted a medical certificate indicating that they are fit to compete in motorsport no later than 5 (Five) working days before the start of the event. This certificate is to be reviewed and processed by MSA Head Office.
- It is the responsibility of the competitor to check the Injury Register and ensure that MSA receives their letter timeously.
Please Note: Competing while appearing on the injury register will result in potential claims being repudiated by the MSA Group Accident Policy. Refer to Appendix L - Article 2.9

Alcohol Consumption and smoking in the pit area.
These are disciplinary infringements. Refer GCR 172 iv) and x).
SA Rally-Raid officials and MSA will apply a zero-tolerance approach.
- Social Media and sharing of information
Think before you post.
Nothing you post online is private.
Don't air your dirty washing in public or make derogatory or negative remarks about competitors, officials, volunteers, event organisers, promoters or MSA on social media. If you are disgruntled, address your discontent with the appropriate persons, organisation or MSA.
Before posting sensational images or footage of motorsport incidents, take a step back, consider the consequences and respect the privacy of the individuals, their family and their loved ones.
Refrain from posting personal opinions, comments or unsubstantiated information.
Social Media is a wonderful communications tool but remember – BE RESPONSIBLE!

- Insurance:
The organisers pay a levy on behalf of every competitor towards a Public Liability insurance policy that MSA holds. Every entrant, competitor, driver or person associated with the entrant who is directly responsible for a claim arising from any accident/incident on the event necessitating a claim against this policy will be liable for the first amount payable (excess) of R 25 000.00 per claim.
